SSL eREADINGS: SOME CONTEXT

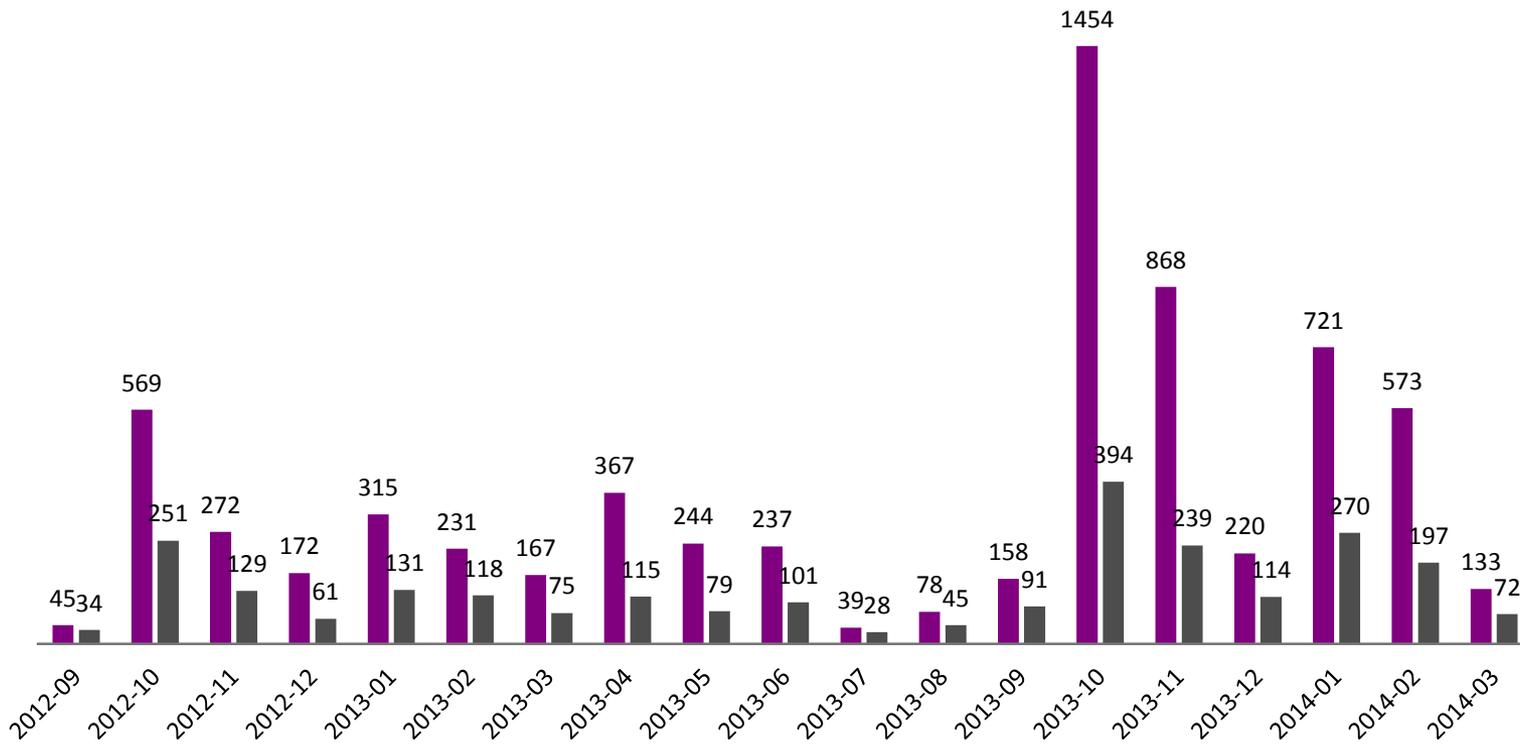
- Launched in Michaelmas 2012
- Hosts scans of chapters and articles on readings lists supported by the SSL
 - Currently over 600 scans
 - Across 17 degree programmes
 - 328 scans uploaded since August 2013
- Site traffic
 - Oct-Dec 2012
 - Visits: 1013
 - Unique visits: 441
 - Oct-Dec 2013
 - Visits: 2542
 - Unique visits: 747

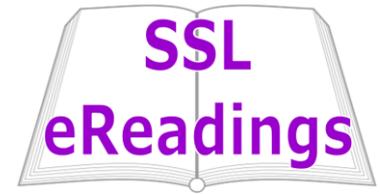

WHY USE WEBPAGES?

- Consistency
 - Branding
 - We wanted our students and course tutors to know that it was the library providing this service
 - Consistent colours with our Bodleian website & news weblog
 - Course pages with scans look the same as our service information pages
- Present extra information alongside scans
- Reduce the number of clicks through a folder hierarchy



BUILDING THE WEBPAGES

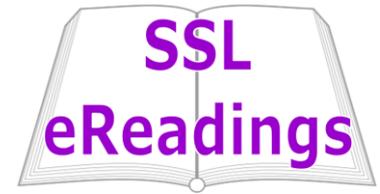
○ **WYSIWYG** or **Code It Yourself?**

- **Hyper Text Markup Language (html)**
 - Describes the structure of a webpage
- **Cascading Style Sheets (css)**
 - Describes the presentation of a webpage

○ **Why CIY?**

- Had completed a module on building webpages at Library School
- Saw an opportunity to put this knowledge into practice
- I find it easier to work with html & css directly than using WYSIWYG programmes
- Some things can't be done with the WebLearn WYSIWYG
 - i.e. forms





CIY: MAKING THINGS EASIER

- Make it readable
 - Space things out and indent
 - Insert comments so you know what you're looking at
- Copy and paste
 - Only type your code out once
 - Create building blocks
 - Insert these blocks where you need them
- Use Notepad++
 - Or similar text editor (gedit, vim, &c...)
 - Syntax highlighting
 - Makes code even more readable



OTHER THINGS TO CONSIDER

- How does the webpage look on...
 - Firefox?
 - Chrome?
 - Internet Explorer?
 - Opera?
 - Safari?
 - Mobile devices?

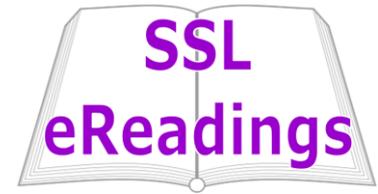

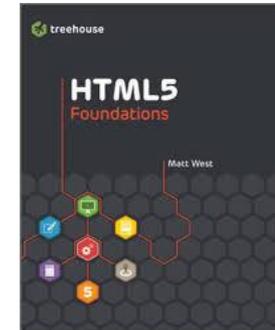

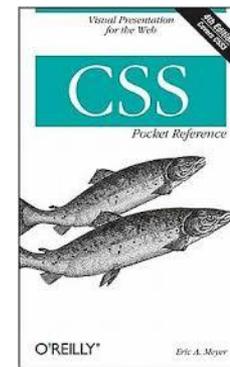
